Since they opened in 2004 more than 13,000 children and families have stayed at the two classic 1912 craftsman style homes directly across from Huntington Memorial Hospital.

They receive 10-15% of their \$650,000 annual budget from McDonalds franchises and the balance from fundraising. They have 3 full-time staff members: Director, Special Events,
